

SEGMENT SPOTLIGHT: WOODRIDGE RAIL TRAIL

This 1.7 mile multi-surface segment connects the Village of Woodridge with the Neversink River. One trailhead can be found at the entrance to Veteran's Memorial Park at the corner of Roosevelt Avenue and Highland Avenue in the center of the Village. From there the trail heads west and traverses a beautiful marsh teeming with wildlife and perfect for birdwatching.

The second trailhead, located where Tabaczynski Road intersects with Avon Lodge/River Road, has ample parking and is often used by anglers fishing the nearby Neversink River.

At one time, the O&W railroad crossed over the Neversink at this spot via a massive trestle. The stone abutments are still visible on the opposite side of Avon Lodge Road. There are plans to use those abutments to support a pedestrian bridge that would connect to the South Fallsburg portion of the trail. That project is in the engineering and permitting phase with bidding scheduled for later this year.

The Sullivan O&W Rail Trail


Alliance is an organization formed to oversee maintenance, marketing and promotion of existing segments of the O&W Rail Trail in Sullivan County. We also work collaboratively to acquire and develop new sections of trail along the former railroad right-of-way.

The Alliance is a an intermunicipal cooperative body whose membership is comprised of representatives of local government and trail advocates.

PARKSVILLE TO LIVINGSTON MANOR: The northern terminus of the O&W Rail Trail is currently located in Parksville (Town of Liberty) at a trailhead located on Old Route 17 adjacent to the Fox Mountain Road overpass. The long range goal is to extend the trail from this location another 4 miles north into Livingston Manor (Town of Rockland) where it would end at Rotary Park, on the outskirts of the downtown business district. The project has been broken up into three phases, and the Town of Liberty (with help from Sullivan County, Sullivan 180 and others) has taken the lead on completing the first phase. Phase I involves developing a 1.8 mile segment from Fox Mountain Road to Sonoma Falls, along portions of the original railroad right-of-way that are currently owned by NYSDOT. The Town is pursuing an agreement with NYSDOT that would allow public access and further development of this trail segment. The project is currently in the engineering and permitting phase, and a \$400,000 state grant has been secured through Assemblywoman Aileen Gunther's office. With any luck, this trail extension will be completed and open to the public next year.
